CYF (Children, Youth and Family Ministry)

I hope you all had a wonderful holiday! I want to start with a huge thank you to everyone who participated in, helped with and supported the Christmas play this year. Kiddos - you were great! Faith and I are so so proud of you. Enjoy your holiday breaks - Sunday School will be back at it on January 5th. Until then I have a gentle challenge for you all as we move into the new year. We hear a lot about resolutions and changes people want to make this time of year, but what if, this year, we try something a little different? Instead of focusing on what you want to change - try picking a one word theme for your year. I picked up this idea a few years ago from Gretchen Rubin, a writer and podcaster that I really like, and she says, "To pick your own one-word theme, try brainstorming a list of possibilities, or just pay attention to a particular word or concept that resonates with you. Your word might be a noun, a verb, or an adjective. There's no wrong way to pick as long as it's meaningful to you." We will do more with these themes in Sunday School in January and we can't wait to hear all your ideas!



To get started, you might ask yourself a few Know Yourself Better questions:

What do you want more (or less) of in your life? (Peace? Satisfaction? Movement?)

What are you curious about? (Adventure? Mystery? Pathways?)

What word has special power or significance? (Peacock? Rally? Bounce?)

The start of a new year has always been a time when we think and talk about change and this year I find myself really thinking on what change means for me, for us at Lakeview and in the world. I keep coming back to the paradox of Theseus's Ship. In his work *Parallel Lives*, Plutarch tells how after Theseus returned from Crete, after slaying the Minotaur, the Athenians kept his ship as a monument of sorts. In order to preserve the ship, the Athenians would replace any piece when it started to show weathering or decay with new and stronger timbers. Eventually, this would mean that the ship would be composed of entirely new materials - setting up the paradox - is it still Theseus's ship?

People have been puzzling over and debating this ever since, but right now the part of this paradox that really stands out to me is that each plank is not what makes Theseus's ship meaningful for the Athenians. While every individual plank, every wooden bolt, every groove and oar is important and meaningful, the ship as a whole and what it stands for is what the Athenians are truly preserving. The value of this ship to them is in its meaning - not its materials.

Lakeview is like that, for me, every single human who has come in contact with Lakeview at any moment is part of making this family what it is today and what it will be in the future, but there is some special, ineffable spark that is quintessentially *Lakeview* that remains unchanged, even as it shifts. The heart of this community is strong, beautiful and focused - and I am so excited for what is going to look like as we move forward. As you think of your personal one-word themes for this year - I invite you to also think of what a one-word theme for Lakeview might be... Change, sure... Horizon, maybe... Family, getting closer... I can't wait to hear your ideas.

Here's to a new year, surrounded by people we love.

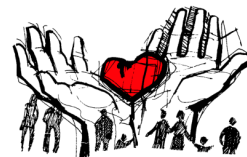

ACTION IN MISSION—(A.I.M.)



Queen City Kitchen is our January Mission of the Month

The AIM Committee continues to support serving meals, lunch now instead of breakfast, at Queen City Kitchen in Walnut Hills. Lakeview Church supports this mission by being “Weekend Warriors,” meaning serving meals on Saturday or Sunday. The kitchen serves hot meals three days a week, but supplying meals on weekends stretches the budget, so local groups like churches fill in the food gaps on weekends. It is rewarding work!

Lakeview has been supporting this effort for about 14 years. We shop for, prepare, and serve the food, and together with the staff, clean up.

Last year they had to relocate the kitchen because the old location on Gilbert Avenue was demolished to build a veterans’ home. Walnut Hills Baptist Church graciously offered their kitchen and dining room facilities to QCK. It is working out well, meshing the church and kitchen schedules, and improving the kitchen facilities.

No one wants to rely on a soup kitchen for daily sustenance, but there are many in this changing neighborhood who just don’t have the means to get all they need. Many are just down on their luck. Many suffer from physical and mental conditions that may keep them from being self-sufficient. Grocery stores are not close, not in walking distance for some. Some are homeless. Some just lack the financial means, the psychological capacity or basic life skills to provide themselves with a meal. Many express their thanks; others give a blank stare and head to the dining room, but they eat with gusto.

FAMILY PROMISE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Lakeview made a commitment several years ago to assist host church St. Pat’s Episcopal Church in Lebanon during their rotation week, and Lakeview handles Monday nights. This happens 4 times a year at the renovated facility on 600 Columbus Rd. in Lebanon.

Next Date: Monday, January 27, 2025

Volunteers are needed to:

–Provide a dish for the evening meal (4 volunteers).

–Host the families during evening hours (about 5:15 p.m. to about 8:45 p.m.)—2 volunteers needed. This involves helping to set out dinner and clean up, as well as hanging out with the guests and maybe doing activities with the kids (bring a craft or art project if you wish, depending on the ages of the children).

–Spend the night—2 volunteers needed. You will have your own space to sleep. There are no real duties except to make sure everyone is accounted for and be there in case any emergencies occur (you will have emergency contact numbers). In the morning you are free to leave as soon as you need to.

We have a quick follow up date, so if you cannot help in January, please consider this March date.

2025 Lakeview Capital Campaign

AS WE LIGHT THE WAY— JANUARY 2025



Greetings from the Capital Campaign Committee! As you may be aware, we “lit the lamp” on January 16, 2022 to officially begin the Capital Campaign to pay for the second mortgage from the Cornerstone Fund. Remember, it is never too late to complete an Intention-to-Give card. Every single one counts toward our goal! **If you are new to Lakeview, there is an opportunity for you to pledge on the 2025 pledge cards.**

There is good news as the actual amount of the loan now stands at **\$17,900.84** (as of December 2nd) since we have been making a monthly payment of \$1,043.29 and we borrowed less than the anticipated amount. Also, Lakeview has **received \$157,777.17** in gifts to the campaign as of December 8th. **THANK YOU!!**

There was an additional balloon payment of \$20,000 paid toward the principal on May 3, 2022 through funds we receive from the Burgett Estate. Also, Executive Council authorized an additional balloon payment of \$40,000.00 which was credited to the mortgage on September 1, 2022. An additional \$20,000.00 was invested with the Cornerstone Fund. That investment matured earning \$98.74 interest and has been deposited in the checking account to make part of the balloon payment in April. **The 2024 balloon payment of \$40,000 was sent to Cornerstone Fund on April 28, 2024 and was applied to the remaining principal.**

Each month in the LINK we will be giving you an update on our progress. You can also look for the Lamp post in Natalie’s office. The small white board attached to it shows the total amount collected. The total amount pledged as of October 10, 2023 is \$145,120.18. **AWESOME!**

Together we can do this, Lakeview friends and family. Help light the way!

It is our hope that we can pay off the remaining balance on this loan early in 2025. Prayerfully consider a gift to The Capital Campaign Fund to make this happen.

Scout Troop 617



If you haven't had a chance yet, take a look at the newly installed Peace Poles between the church and Fellowship Hall. This was an Eagle Scout project led by scout Max Warnecke of Troop 617, with special thanks to Steve Friedhoff, the Scouts, and Dave Maile for assisting with the work and planning, and to Natalie for handling the ordering.

After much discussion, we chose eight languages for the poles, based on our community and the most common languages in the world. English and Spanish are there because so many people in the Americas speak one or the other. We chose the Myaamia Language because of the history of the Miami peoples in the region. We chose Swahili because of Lakeview's connection with Kenya. The other four languages are: Chinese, Hebrew, Arabic, and Hindi.

WELCOMECORPS

Our small group of adults (most of us from Lakeview) is ready to welcome a family of refugees through the Welcome Corps program, created by the U.S. government in January 2023. A refugee family is vetted by the U.S. State Department, and they go through many steps, often waiting years to be offered refugee status to enter the U.S. We expect a family to be assigned to us in the next month or so.

Each of us in the sponsor group is contributing funds and time to support the resettlement of this family in Cincinnati.

We also need YOUR HELP with additional funds to support this family as they seek and gain employment, sign up for social services, enroll in schools, obtain medical care, learn how to use public transportation, attend English language classes, and all that is required to become self-sufficient and engaged members of this community.

Funds will support rental of an apartment for at least three months, purchase of new bedding and linens, as well as purchase of all the basic kitchen, bathroom, bedroom, and living room setup, including furniture and supply needs.

The family will need clothing, food, household supplies, laundry detergent, medical supplies - look around your home and imagine starting with nothing, and imagine what will be needed by this family to live here. They will need cell phones and service, internet service, a laptop. Tables, chairs, lights. The list is long. With your and our help together, we can kindly welcome one immigrant refugee family and enable them to live in our community.

If you have, or know of someone nearby who has used furniture in GOOD condition, bed frames, lights, kitchen table and chairs, kitchen equipment, dishes, etc., please contact Donna Maile. We can arrange to pick up or receive items from you.
