We are so excited for what is coming up in the Children, Youth and Family Ministry here at Lakeview! This month begins our trial run for our new ideas for our growing Sunday School programs. We will officially begin our teen Sunday School group this month on the weeks that Harmony UU is not here.\* Thank you to everyone who has signed up to help with the teen and youth classes - we really appreciate you and hope that you get as much out of the time with our youngest members as we do!

For the month of March (and until all repair work is done in the CE wing) our Sunday School classes will be meeting in the Conference Room - on the weeks that Harmony is not at Lakeview - our teens will stay in the Conference Room for deeper discussions and project planning while our youth classes will go over to Fellowship Hall for more play-based learning and lessons. Each week they will have 2 or 3 stations that will allow them to delve into different aspects of our Sunday School lesson - with crafts, activities and stories. We hope that this time allows them to connect to the lessons, each other and volunteers through play and movement.

Our plan is to really commit to this new approach through the month of March and then discuss with the kids, teens, volunteers and CYF staff after Easter about the experience. If it goes as well as we think it will, this will become the groundwork for how we will continue to use our spaces and Sunday School time moving forward. Allowing us time all together in Room 7 on Harmony weeks and with smaller age-divided group time in the Conference Room and Fellowship Hall the rest of the time.

**A note for parents & caretakers:** We will be bringing back Sunday School sign-outs with this new plan - with more locations and moving pieces we need to ensure that each child is where they need to be and with the people they are meant to be with. So please come pick up your kiddos after Sunday School and don't forget to sign them out as you go!

As always, thank you to the wonderful Lakeview family for your continued love and support of the Children, Youth and Family Ministry and if you would like to be more involved there are volunteer signups on the Worship Volunteer sheet in the lobby.

Interested in learning more about the UCC’s background and foundational values?



The classes will cover the UCC’s essential themes of Autonomy, Tradition, Diversity, Covenant, and more.





# ACTION IN MISSION—(A.I.M.)

## March Missions of the Month

The first Sunday in March offering will be dedicated to funding the Maundy Thursday hygiene kits that we have assembled for the last several years. The UCC's Church World Service distributes all types of kits (cleanup buckets, blankets, disaster preparedness, and hygiene) when and where disasters such as hurricanes and floods strike.

Natalie applied for the UCC Global H.O.P.E. Kit Matching Grant again this year, which we were awarded, and it will cover the processing and shipping costs for the kits, as well as helping to defray the cost of the kit items.

We are collecting on the first Sunday instead of the fifth Sunday because the calendar dictates that the funds are needed quickly. This mission nicely leads into our monthly mission, One Great Hour of Sharing, which collects for disaster relief through Church World Services. We will assemble these kits during our Maundy Thursday Service of Service, on April 2nd.

From an email we received after our notice of the grant award:

*...Once again, on behalf of our Heartland Conference Disaster Response Team, I want to share our heartfelt appreciation for Lakeview UCC's outreach of dedication, compassion, and love. The creation of 100 CWS personal hygiene kits come at a time that so many are experiencing the unfortunate devastation of disasters...be they from nature, or man-made. These kits, while seemingly small, will go to victims of disaster at one of their lowest times in their lives. They represent caring, love, and most of all...hope. Please express our gratitude and appreciation to the wonderful folks at Lakeview! Blessing to each of you.*

### March Missions of the Month

The March mission is **One Great Hour of Sharing**, in which we join with Christians in seven other denominations to support relief services wherever and whenever disaster strikes in the U.S.A. and abroad, and also to provide long-term, sustainable development assistance, refugee resettlement, and social services. Tornadoes, wildfires, earthquakes, floods, and hurricanes ravaged communities worldwide, leaving behind devastation and extreme stress. Drought, violence and COVID wreaked havoc in communities, often leaving people without food and resources for themselves and their family. The UCC responds to disasters such as these through our One Great Hour of Sharing offering. Programs and grants help communities launch long-term recovery following such disasters.



A portion of our OGHS offering also goes to refugee relief and resettlement across the world. As an example of our gifts at work, several UCC churches are actively hosting or supporting refugee families, often in coordination with churches of other denominations. Countless other churches have collected supplies and funds toward this effort. Tool kits and online training sessions are available through the UCC for churches supporting refugee families, all because of offerings to One Great Hour of Sharing.

OGHS will continue to help other poor communities find and develop new sources of food and clean water, and improve health standards. Efforts to empower women and families to become more self-sufficient are also supported through this mission. See the United Church of Christ website (search One Great Hour of Sharing) for more information on this and other ways OGHS helps those in need, and for statistics on how efficiently collected money is used. Specifically, look at the FAQs under OGHS.

### Plan to stay after worship on Sunday, March 15 for a Special Coffee Hour.

Instead, we invite you to participate in an expanded coffee hour which will include the opportunity to hear more from our guest speaker that day, **Megan Bergert, Minister for Refugee and Migration Services for the National UCC**. (Her work is funded through the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering, our March Mission of the Month.)

We envision offering a variety of finger foods in the lobby after church, with the availability of some tables and chairs, as well as seating in the sanctuary for those who feel they can balance food and drinks in that space.

## FAMILY PROMISE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Lakeview made a commitment several years ago to assist host church St. Pat’s Episcopal Church in Lebanon during their rotation week, and Lakeview handles Monday nights. This happens 4 times a year at the renovated facility on 600 Cincinnati Ave. in Lebanon.

**Next Date: Monday, April 27, 2026**

Volunteers are needed to:

–Provide a dish for the evening meal (4 volunteers).

–Host the families during evening hours (about 5 p.m. to about 8:45 p.m.)—2 volunteers needed. This involves helping to set out dinner and clean up, as well as hanging out with the guests and maybe doing activities with the kids (bring a craft or art project if you wish, depending on the ages of the children).

–Spend the night—2 volunteers needed. You will have your own space to sleep. There are no real duties except to make sure everyone is accounted for, turn off lights and lock up the common area, and be there in case any emergencies occur (you will have emergency contact numbers). In the morning you are free to leave as soon as you need to.
