FROM TODD'S DESK

By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.
 -Luke 1:78-79 NRSV

It's December and things are getting busy! In addition to all the things happening in the community (concerts, meals, shopping...) it brings with it at Lakeview the season of Advent and the celebration of Christmas! There are lots of traditions during this time of year that warm us and bring us great comfort; lighting the candles on the Advent wreath, putting up the Nativity set, hearing familiar old Christmas songs, the joy of being with family, and re-watching It's A Wonderful Life or Elf or Die Hard (yes, it has been decided that it is a Christmas movie now)...

While our memories and celebrations are familiar and cozy, the truths in and around the Christmas narratives are far less nostalgic- they challenged the world then, and continue to challenge it today. For as we consider these Christmas stories, we find a family targeted by a violent political system that was forced to flee their home and seek safety and welcome in a foreign land. We find a couple without a place to stay that is turned away when they seek shelter. We read titles like 'Prince of Peace' and 'Light of the World' -and while these terms have become familiar and predictable to us in the church, in its original context it was radical language in an empire where those titles were reserved for the Roman Emperor.

These stories may be familiar to us, but we can't let them become 'old and dull' to us because they still have the power to shake the very foundations of the world. This is not just the same old story, but is part of THE STORY and if God is still speaking, we must keep listening and asking, 'What new images and

It is absolutely no secret that this is my favorite time of the year, but this year I find myself not just looking forward to the Advent and Christmas seasons, but *needing* them. In Sunday School we talk a lot about Advent being a season of anticipation and preparation... and it absolutely is that, but both of those words seem to suggest that we are adding to our already full plates. On top of everything else, now we have to prepare for gifts, family gatherings, extra church services, parties, travel... AND remember to prepare our hearts and lives for the coming of a baby that is meant to change this crazy world into something more aligned with God’s love for all?!? That is a lot. I get it, I do, but what if... *what if...* we make the choice to intentionally slow down this year? There is a quote by Jan L Richardson that I keep coming back to, in her book *Night Visions: Searching the Shadows of Advent and Christmas*, she writes,

“The season of Advent means there is something on the horizon the likes of which we have never seen before.... So stay. Sit. Linger. Tarry. Ponder. Wait. Behold. Wonder. There will be time enough for running. For rushing. For worrying. For pushing. For now, stay. Wait. Something is on the horizon.”

Would we change how we approach this season if we reconnect with the idea that something new is coming? That God, who is always here with us, is simultaneously standing at the ready to do something brand new with our lives - if we can just force ourselves to slow down and notice it. Notice the places where God touches our lives everyday - and the places that God uses us to touch the lives of others. This season, can we find it in ourselves to slow the chaos just a bit and find time to connect - with ourselves, with each other, and with God? I know we can. I have watched this congregation do bigger and harder things than this time and time again.

So I will leave you with my Advent wish for us all - peace. For you and your family, for our congregation, our neighbors and this whole broken and hurting world. May we seek out God’s peace this season and find some rest so we are able to stand again, ready for God’s new thing.

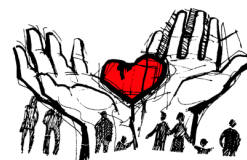

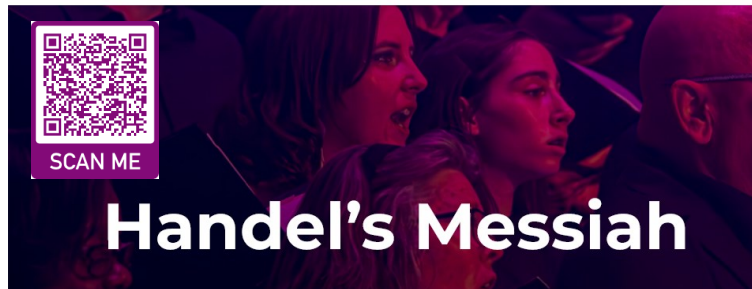

2024 Lakeview Capital Campaign

AS WE LIGHT THE WAY– DECEMBER 2024

Greetings from the Capital Campaign Committee! As you may be aware, we “lit the lamp” on January 16, 2022 to officially begin the Capital Campaign to pay for the second mortgage from the Cornerstone Fund.

Remember, it is never too late to complete an Intention-to-Give card. Every single one counts toward our goal! **If you are new to Lakeview, there is an opportunity for you to pledge on the 2025 pledge cards.**



There is good news as the actual amount of the loan now stands at **\$17,971.83** (as of November 1st) since we have been making a monthly payment of \$1,043.29 and we borrowed less than the anticipated amount. Also, Lakeview has **received \$157,428.00** in gifts to the campaign as of November 7th. **THANK YOU!!**

There was an additional balloon payment of \$20,000 paid toward the principal on May 3, 2022 through funds we receive from the Burgett Estate. Also, Executive Council authorized an additional balloon payment of \$40,000.00 which was credited to the mortgage on September 1, 2022. An additional \$20,000.00 was invested with the Cornerstone Fund. That investment matured earning \$98.74 interest and has been deposited in the checking account to make part of the balloon payment in April. **The 2024 balloon payment of \$40,000 was sent to Cornerstone Fund on April 28, 2024 and was applied to the remaining principal.**

Each month in the LINK we will be giving you an update on our progress. You can also look for the Lamp post in Natalie’s office. The small white board attached to it shows the total amount collected. The total amount pledged as of October 10, 2023 is \$145,120.18. **AWESOME!**

Together we can do this, Lakeview friends and family. Help light the way!

It is our hope that we can pay off the remaining balance on this loan early in 2025. Prayerfully consider a gift to The Capital Campaign Fund to make this happen.

ASSISTANT TREASURER'S UPDATE

THE DUKE SAGA for LAKEVIEW as of 11/2024

As many of you know beginning in February of 2023 we began getting crazy billing from Duke - huge bills, that went back to 2022. After multiple calls to Midwest Utilities (our consultant) failed to get a response, we began to deal with Duke ourselves (quite an "adventure" in itself)

The short story:

In 2022 Duke Energy put in a new computer system to "simplify" their billing - it was & is a disaster. That led to Lakeview getting crazy (I prefer the term Wackadoodle) high and non-sensical bills starting in February 2023. This issue was finally "resolved" in August with a huge credit (due to Duke's mis-billing since 2022). We lived on this credit for the rest of 2023. We started 2024 with a credit of \$4500.

February 2024 - the next crazy bill. After multiple calls, we filed a complaint with the PUCO (Public Utilities Commission of Ohio) & Duke gave us our own contact person .

May - Duke decided after redoing the bills back to 2022 they owed us more money!? We were puzzled, but they insisted they were right(?).

June- Another huge bill - Duke said the last re-billing was wrong and so they redid it again. We paid \$3000 while we waited for the results. Come July, they said they owed us *more*.

September - The new bill showed that we *owed* \$6500. This was due to catching up with all the 2024 billing (\$10,000). It also included *exceptionally high usage bills for January & February*, which seem wrong. Our consultant is looking into it but holds out little hope for a resolution by Duke.

October - Duke sets us up on a payment plan where we pay off the \$6500 over a 12 month period - adding \$542 each month to the regular bill.

What Needs to be Done:

The Midwest Utilities consultant (MWU) will check our bills every month. MWU will also pay particular attention to February billing -since no one can explain why that happens!?

We need a volunteer to read the meter of the main church & keep records of it - so we can check Duke's numbers.

We are putting together a small committee to look over Duke's billing as we receive it & compare Duke's numbers to our usage. We will meet in person - but the meetings will be kept as short as possible & scheduled for everyone's convenience.

Please let me know if you are interested.

We need to be careful of energy usage (especially in the winter months) in case we really used that much energy this past year.
