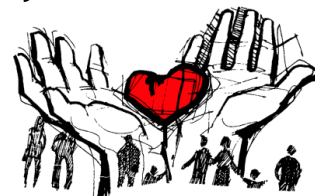

Lakeview UCC will be observing Scout Sunday on February 8th.

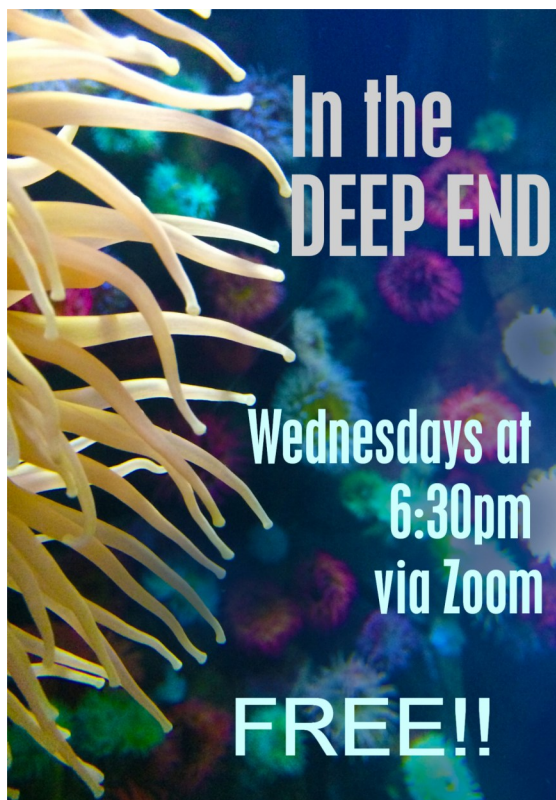
This is a time to acknowledge our scouts and the contributions scouting makes in our community. This year, Scout Sunday falls on Scouting's anniversary date, February 8th!

LENT AT LAKEVIEW

It begins with ashes.....

Join us Wednesday, Feb. 18 at 6:30 pm for our Zoom Ash Wednesday service.

Our Lenten journey begins with a quiet service of reflection, and the imposition of ashes. It will only be approximately 30 minutes. Please pick up an ash kit or have some ashes or a small amount of dirt with you wherever you are. The zoom link for this service will be available in the weekly update email and in the bulletin on

About Our Lenten Theme: *Living Stones*

Ordinary stones. They build structures, they can hurt us. They hold buildings together, they provide a channel through which water flows. They can be beautiful decorations in our gardens. They can be nuisances in our vegetable gardens. This season of Lent we will each have a stone to carry, as a reminder of the choices we have to be living stones of growth, building each other and Lakeview up into a "spiritual house."



Beginning on Lent 1, February, 22, you are welcome to take a stone with you to keep with you during the season. On Palm Sunday, we will pile the stones on the altar, leaving our burdens of Lent and our prayers for new life. Or, you may keep your stone as a reminder to be a living stone in the world, full of God light.

Sharing our Stones

On Lent 2 (March 1st), there will be extra stones in a basket on the welcome table. You are invited to write one burden on the stone with the marker provided and place back in the basket. At the end of the service, you are invited to take another stone on your way out from the basket, and pray for the burden written on that stone to be lifted from whoever wrote it.

We will do this until Palm Sunday, sharing our burdens and stones, every week taking a different stone, not knowing its owner, but praying for them and their concerns through this sacred season.

LENT MADNESS COMES TO LAKEVIEW!!!



Lent Madness began in 2010 as the brainchild of the Rev. Tim Schenck, and Episcopal priest. In seeking a fun, engaging way for people to learn about the men and women comprising the Church's Calendar of Saints, Tim came up with this unique Lenten devotion. Combining his love of sports with his passion for the lives of the saints, Lent Madness was born.

The format is straightforward: 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Sainly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch. Lent Madness allows people to get to know some amazing people who have come before us in the faith and reminds one another that there's no reason for a dreary Lenten discipline. If this helps people connect with the risen Christ during this season of penitence and renewal, and have a bit of fun in the process, then it continues to be worthwhile.

February's Mission of the Month is Caracole, an organization located in Cincinnati that provides HIV prevention, testing and harm reduction programs for the community, as well as housing and health care assistance for individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS.



Caracole has been offering services to adults living with HIV/AIDS since 1987 and is the only HIV/AIDS organization in our region. The agency annually serves thousands of people living throughout the Tri-State region in Southwest Ohio, Northern Kentucky, and Southeast Indiana.

Lakeview UCC has been supporting Caracole for more than a decade with both monetary and in-kind donations.

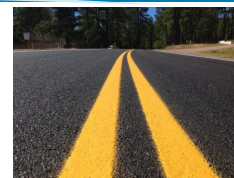

2025 Lakeview Capital Campaign

PAVING THE WAY– JANUARY 2026



On Sunday, March 16th, 2025, at the congregational meeting of Lakeview UCC, a vote was taken to extend the 2022 Capital Campaign. Now that the second mortgage has been paid off (February 24, 2025), extending the campaign will enable the church to gather funds for much needed property projects.

In a few years, the church will need the roof shingles replaced and that will also be a major expense. Currently council is considering replacing one of the HVAC units at an approximate cost of \$12,000.

So, prayerfully consider extending your commitment to the capital campaign. **As of January 6th, we have \$13,622.69 already.** Any gift is gratefully appreciated.
